More documents released in Casey Anthony case

ORLANDO --

In a letter written to her daughter Casey Anthony, Cindy Anthony writes she finally removed Caylee's potty chair from her bathroom.

She says it's so hard to let go and "I still see her."

The letter is just the latest in about 1,000 new pages of documents in the case against Casey.

Included in the discovery are e-mails from Cindy's mother.

In her 2008 e-mails to other friends and family, she showed concern over Cindy Anthony's mental health due to marital problems and financial difficulties.

The e-mails timelined Cindy's growing concern over not hearing from her granddaughter for several weeks.

Cindy's mother wrote in the weeks following Caylee's disappearance,"What is new with the Cindy and Casey saga? I'm hoping another week goes by without her seeing that baby."

Documents also show a judge granting investigators a wiretap application for a tracking device to be placed on the Anthony family's landline and cell phones.

There are also handwritten notes from what appears to be investigators regarding pen pal letters from inmate Robyn Adams.

There are also documents of a complaint Cindy Anthony made to the Orange County Sheriff's Office over an obscene phone call. In early 2009, Cindy received a phone call from a man known as Giovani offering up a friend who was an ex-convict who would be willing to take the blame for Caylee's disappearance. That would have freed her daughter.

Cindy refused to take any more phone calls from the man and turned it over to authorities.
